And welcome to Night three of the Festival of Lights,

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the Feast of Dedication, or better known as Hanukkah.

I hope you are enjoying this week

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as I am with my kids and my family.

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And I pray that each and every night you not only learn

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something new yourself that your kids,

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your family enjoys the fellowship and the fun and the power

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of the Word of God through light.

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Because that's what this is all about.

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It's about transferring light from one generation

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to the next generation, creating new traditions and new reality

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for what this season of the year looks like.

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So without further ado,

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let's dive in.

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We talked about on day one the light of creation.

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And we talked

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about the whole story of Hanukkah and how Hanukkah was passed

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down.

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The Festival of Lights was inaugurated by a single man who felt

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the unction and the

desire and the zeal to stand up for righteousness.

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And that is really a theme through this entire festival,

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is righteousness doing the right thing, following

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God's Divine Commandments is what deacons means.

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There's dictionary in the Greek, which is what righteous means.

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So we're going to try to let the light shine inside of us

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in such a way that God will be glorified through our deeds.

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and the best way we can do that is to transfer

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these ideas, these paradigms into the next generation.

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So the first night was the light of creation.

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We talked about that and how that was supposed

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to be passed down through Adam, but he blew it.

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God has to reintroduce himself into the next generation.

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He does that through Noah.

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And so Noah carried that light and thank God that he did that.

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He was a righteous man, more than anybody in his generation.

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The Father

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chose him to save all of humanity, quite frankly, the world.

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The first petting zoo

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was on Noah's Ark, seven by seven, two by two, and they came 2:01

and repopulated the earth and the light was passed down.

That was night two.

Tonight is night three.

And we're going to talk about Abraham.

Who could be better at transferring the light

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or taking that torch from Noah's hand, if you will, than Abraham?

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Abraham is the father of many nations, right?

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Our father, Abraham, who had many sons.

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And I am one of them. And so are you.

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So let's just praise the Lord, shall we?

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And as the old song goes.

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And so we're going to talk about Abraham tonight.

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So what do we do when we...when we're sitting down with our kids?

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You know, of course,

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you can play a dreidel game, you can put on some worship music.

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It just really depends on the ages of your kids, your family.

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You can have a Bible study

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if you're older and you don't have small ones.

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You can think of different ideas of how you can

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illustrate how we're supposed to walk in the light.

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And so tonight

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with the story

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of Abraham, one of the things that you can do

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is you can read out of Genesis chapter 15.

3:00

That's the story where God introduces Himself to Abraham

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in a dramatic and a cinematic

way, where He...this is the 3:11 covenant of the pieces, where He asked Abraham 3:15 to bring animals to Him, cuts them in half, 3:17 and then He has to walk in between the pieces. 3:20 That's the ancient Eastern Covenant. The problem is, is that God doesn't let Abraham 3:26 even be awake during this time period, he makes him fall asleep. 3:29 And then there is a burning torch 3:31 and a pot that is of a flame that is going through these pieces, representing God himself. 3:38 And then, of course, 3:40 The Word of God, which ends up manifesting himself as YHWH Tzeva'ot, or the Lord of Hosts, the Angel of the Lord 3:48 and English, which ends up being Yeshua Himself. Yeah, eventually as the Word becomes flesh. 3:53 And so this is a beautiful picture you can begin to talk about 3:57 to your kids, that this is where the covenant began and...and 4:01 then you can talk about how covenants are created, that there's a meal that's instituted and people, they trust one another and they eat each other's 4:12 part of each other's meal in representation that 'I'm 4:15 going to eat part of your half. You're going to eat my half' and together that makes a whole.

It's very much like a marriage ceremony.

4:22

It's a very 'marriage' type of covenant.

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So you can talk about covenant and you can talk about promises

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and contracts and commitments and oaths,

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and you can make

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that part of being a light is always telling the truth

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and making sure that you keep your end of the deal

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when you make a covenant with God.

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And every time that you're taking communion,

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are you taking the bread and the wine on Shabbat, then you are...

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that little one

4:46

piece of bread, is representing the entire covenant.

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That's how Eastern covenants work.

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So you can begin to explain that, that when you say that you love

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YHWH, you love God, and you want to follow Him,

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that means that you want

to keep His whole covenant the best way that you can.

And so from the heart, the Father begins to teach us

5:08

His ways, His truths, His decrees, His commandments

5:11

and His image, which is ultimately the most important thing.

So on night three, you can focus on the beginning of

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covenant is keeping oaths, keeping promises,

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and you can read through Genesis 15 or you might decide, Hey,

you know what, I'm going to talk about the

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whole story of Abraham

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having to sacrifice his only begotten son, Isaac,

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which comes a little bit after that.

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So you can you can go to that story

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and you can read

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that to your children, and you can show the parallel

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when it says it took them three days journey

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and then he looked off and he saw Mount Moriah,

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the very place where the Messiah was going to be crucified.

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That very place where the temple is, was where

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Isaac was going to be sacrificed.

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And you can talk about how Isaac was the light,

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the transfer of the light from Abraham to Isaac.

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And because of Abraham's obedience,

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God used him in an extraordinary way to progeny

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an entire nation that would carry the light

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for literally billions of people throughout time.

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And so we can talk about how single decisions affect

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generations and how important it is to make the right decision

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every single time that you're faced with something important.

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And so there's a lot of different ways that you can do it.

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You can tell, maybe,

there was another story of Abraham that you really enjoy.

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I encourage you not to make it super long if you have small kids,

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but if you just adults,

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have a Bible study on Abraham and ask yourself 'what kind of

character did Abraham have and what parts of his character 6:48

do I have, and what parts do I not have?'

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And then ask the father to help you be like Father Abraham,

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to trust Him with your heart, mind, soul and strength.

To have the faith of Abraham that no matter what you face,

that you can be sure that you will trust Him,

I want you to sacrifice this.' You'll say, 'Father,

thank you so much for the ability to sacrifice this for You.

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It is an honor and a privilege

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to sacrifice my life, if You need me to,

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because you are infinite and I'm finite,

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and this world is very temporal.' So anyway, that's night three.

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You can edit some worship songs if you want, maybe some dancing,

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who knows?
